## SVDP Haiti Sharing Appeal

*Jesus taught us, "Whatsoever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me." Matthew 25:40*



**Father Adner, Pastor of St. Francis of Assisi  
Bompardopolis, Haiti**



In 2007 the parishioners of SVDP answered Jesus' call by adopting the school children of St. Francis of Assisi parish community. Since that time our parish family has provided the financial support for construction of schools, salaries for teachers, food and school supplies for the children and so much more. Today there are over 2,600 children in grades K-6 attending the 13 mission schools in and surrounding Bompardopolis and 125 children in grades 7-12 attending the high school, constructed in 2010 and expanded in 2013. We celebrated our first graduating class in 2017 and four of these 2017 graduates are now seniors at the University of St. Francis of Assisi in Port-au-Prince.

Since 2007, the Haiti mission teams have made 11 mission trips to St. Francis of Assisi parish community in Bompardopolis, Haiti. The purpose of these trips is to follow-up on various projects, verify the use of funds, deliver supplies, visit the schools, to seek an understanding of the culture and conditions in Bompardopolis, to build relationships, and to grow spiritually about what it means to have a preference for the poor. Father Adner, the teachers, parents and the school children are so appreciative of the efforts of our church community. Hopefully, you can share in their sense of gratitude, hope and love through the Haiti display pictures in the church, through the shared stories on the SVDP Facebook account, in the letters written by the college students published in today's bulletin (page 6-7), and from the stories shared by those who made the mission trips over the years.

Each trip we experience ways in which the gospel of Jesus Christ is alive in Bompardopolis and our spiritual understanding of what it means to have a preference for the poor is forever deepened. Unfortunately, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, we were not able to make a mission trip this past year. However, I am happy to report that in September, school resumed and plans are in place to celebrate the fifth high school graduating class this upcoming May. Also, there have not been any known COVID-19 cases. However, testing for the virus is inadequate for Haiti's population. Therefore, it is important that we continue to pray for the St. Francis of Assisi parish community, the school children, teachers and their families, that they will be protected from the virus.

Thank you for your continued support of this annual mission appeal as our parish has been blessed in the relationship with our adopted family in Bompardopolis. Please continue to pray the Haiti mission prayer with your family:

*Make us worthy, Lord, to serve the children of Haiti and all  
our fellow men throughout the world, who live and die in poverty and hunger.  
Give them today, through our hands, their daily bread and through our  
understanding love, give them hope, peace and joy. Amen.*

## Campaña de Compartir con Haití de SVDP

Jesús nos enseña, *“En verdad les digo que, cuando lo hicieron con alguno de los más pequeños de estos mis hermanos, me lo hicieron a mí.”* Mateo, 25:40

En 2007, los feligreses de SVDP respondieron al llamado de Jesús adoptando a los niños de la escuela de la comunidad parroquial de San Francisco de Asís. Desde entonces, nuestra familia parroquial ha proporcionado el apoyo financiero para la construcción de escuelas, salarios para maestros, alimentos y útiles escolares para los niños y mucho más. Hoy en día hay más de 2,600 niños en los grados K-6 que asisten a las 13 escuelas de la misión en Bombardopolis y sus alrededores y 125 niños en los grados 7-12 que asisten a la escuela secundaria, construida en 2010 y ampliada en 2013. Celebramos nuestra primera clase de graduados en 2017 y cuatro de estos graduados de 2017 ahora son estudiantes de último año en la Universidad de St. Francis of Assisi en Port-au-Prince.

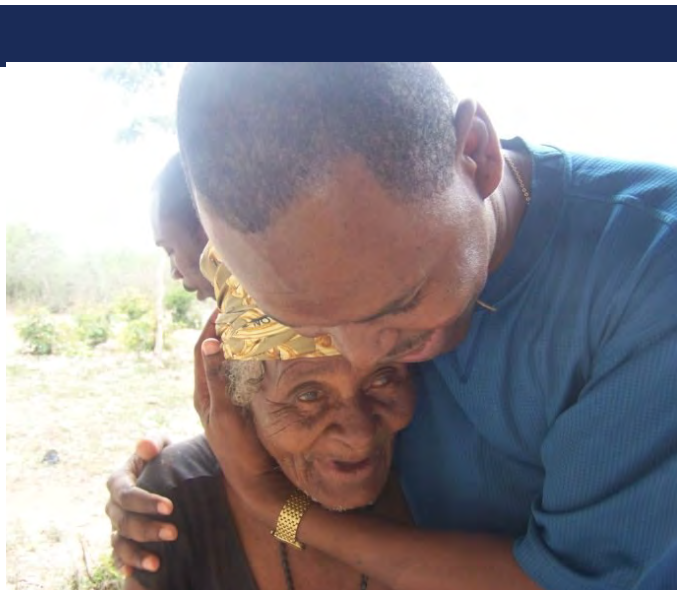
Desde 2007, los equipos misioneros de Haití han realizado 11 viajes misioneros a la comunidad parroquial de San Francisco de Asís en Bombardopolis, Haití. El propósito de estos viajes es dar seguimiento a diversos proyectos, verificar el uso de fondos, entregar suministros, visitar las escuelas, buscar una comprensión de la cultura y las condiciones en Bombardopolis, construir relaciones y crecer espiritualmente sobre lo que significa tener preferencia por los pobres. El Padre Adner, los maestros, los padres y los niños de la escuela están muy agradecidos por los esfuerzos de nuestra comunidad parroquial. Con suerte, puede compartir su sentido de gratitud, esperanza y amor a través de las imágenes de exhibición de Haití en la iglesia, a través de las historias compartidas en la cuenta de Facebook de SVDP, en las cartas escritas por los estudiantes universitarios publicadas en el boletín (pagina 6-7) de hoy y de las historias compartidas por quienes hicieron los viajes misioneros a lo largo de los años.

En cada viaje experimentamos formas en las que el evangelio de Jesucristo está vivo en Bombardopolis y nuestra comprensión espiritual de lo que significa tener una preferencia por los pobres se profundiza para siempre. Desafortunadamente, debido a la pandemia de COVID-19, no pudimos hacer un viaje misionero el año pasado. Sin embargo, me complace informar que en septiembre, la escuela se reanudó y hay planes para celebrar la quinta clase de graduados de la escuela secundaria el mayo próximo. Además, no se han conocido casos de COVID-19. Sin embargo, las pruebas del virus son inadecuadas para la población de Haití. Por lo tanto, es importante que continuemos orando por la comunidad parroquial de San Francisco de Asís, los alumnos, los maestros y sus familias, para que estén protegidos del virus.

Gracias por su continuo apoyo a este llamamiento misionero anual ya que nuestra parroquia ha sido bendecida en la relación con nuestra familia adoptiva en Bombardopolis. Continúe rezando la oración misionera de Haití con su familia:

*Haznos dignos, Señor, para servir a los niños de Haití y a todos nuestros semejantes en todo el mundo, que viven y mueren en la pobreza y el hambre. Dale hoy, a través de nuestras manos, su pan de cada día y a través de nuestro amor comprensivo, dales esperanza, paz y alegría. Amén*

## Readings: III Sunday of Lent

### Reading I: Ex 17:3-7

The In those days, in their thirst for water, the people grumbled against Moses, saying, “Why did you ever make us leave Egypt? Was it just to have us die here of thirst with our children and our livestock?” So Moses cried out to the LORD, “What shall I do with this people? a little more and they will stone me!” The LORD answered Moses, “Go over there in front of the people, along with some of the elders of Israel, holding in your hand, as you go, the staff with which you struck the river. I will be standing there in front of you on the rock in Horeb. Strike the rock, and the water will flow from it for the people to drink.” This Moses did, in the presence of the elders of Israel. The place was called Massah and Meribah, because the Israelites quarreled there and tested the LORD, saying, “Is the LORD in our midst or not?”

### Reading II: Rom 5:1-2, 5-8

Brothers and sisters:

Since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have gained access by faith to this grace in which we stand, and we boast in hope of the glory of God.

And hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us. For Christ, while we were still helpless, died at the appointed time for the ungodly. Indeed, only with difficulty does one die for a just person, though perhaps for a good person one might even find courage to die. But God proves his love for us in that while we were still sinners Christ died for us.

### Verse Before the Gospel: Jn 4:42, 15

Lord, you are truly the Savior of the world;

give me living water, that I may never thirst again.

### Gospel: Jn 4:5-42

Jesus came to a town of Samaria called Sychar, near the plot of land that Jacob had given to his son Joseph. Jacob's well was there. Jesus, tired from his journey, sat down there at the well. It was about noon.

A woman of Samaria came to draw water. Jesus said to her, “Give me a drink.”

His disciples had gone into the town to buy food. The Samaritan woman said to him, “How can you, a Jew, ask me, a Samaritan woman, for a drink?”

—For Jews use nothing in common with Samaritans.—

Jesus answered and said to her, “If you knew the gift of God and who is saying to you, ‘Give me a drink,’ you would have asked him and he would have given you living water.” The woman said to him, “Sir, you do not even have a bucket and the cistern is deep; where then can you get this living water? Are you greater than our father Jacob, who gave us this cistern and drank from it himself with his children and his flocks?” Jesus answered and said to her, “Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again; but whoever drinks the water I shall give will never thirst; the water I shall give will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life.” The woman said to him, “Sir, give me this water, so that I may not be thirsty or have to keep coming here to draw water.”

Jesus said to her,

“Go call your husband and come back.” The woman answered and said to him, “I do not have a husband.” Jesus answered her, “You are right in saying, ‘I do not have a husband.’ For you have had five husbands, and the one you have now is not your husband. What you have said is true.” The woman said to him, “Sir, I can see that you are a prophet. Our ancestors worshiped on this mountain; but you people say that the place to worship is in Jerusalem.” Jesus said to her, “Believe me, woman, the hour is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem. You people worship what you do not understand; we worship what we understand, because salvation is from the Jews. But the hour is coming, and is now here, when true worshipers will worship the Father in Spirit and truth; and indeed the Father seeks such people to worship him. God is Spirit, and those who worship him must worship in Spirit and truth.” The woman said to him, “I know that the Messiah is coming, the one called the Christ; when he comes, he will tell us everything.” Jesus said to her, “I am he, the one speaking with you.”

At that moment his disciples returned, and were amazed that he was talking with a woman, but still no one said, “What are you looking for?” or “Why are you talking with her?” The woman left her water jar and went into the town and said to the people, “Come see a man who told me everything I have done. Could he possibly be the Christ?” They went out of the town and came to him. Meanwhile, the disciples urged him, “Rabbi, eat.” But he said to them, “I have food to eat of which you do not know.” So the disciples said to one another, “Could someone have brought him something to eat?” Jesus said to them, “My food is to do the will of the one who sent me and to finish his work. Do you not say, ‘In four months the harvest will be here?’ I tell you, look up and see the fields ripe for the harvest. The reaper is already receiving payment and gathering crops for eternal life, so that the sower and reaper can rejoice together. For here the saying is verified that ‘One sows and another reaps.’ I sent you to reap what you have not worked for; others have done the work, and you are sharing the fruits of their work.”

Many of the Samaritans of that town began to believe in him because of the word of the woman who testified, “He told me everything I have done.” When the Samaritans came to him, they invited him to stay with them; and he stayed there two days. Many more began to believe in him because of his word, and they said to the woman, “We no longer believe because of your word; for we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this is truly the savior of the world.”

## Escrituras: III Domingo de Cuaresma

### Primera Lectura: Ex 17, 3-7

En aquellos días, el pueblo, torturado por la sed, fue a protestar contra Moisés, diciéndole: “¿Nos has hecho salir de Egipto para hacernos morir de sed a nosotros, a nuestros hijos y a nuestro ganado?” Moisés clamó al Señor y le dijo: “¿Qué puedo hacer con este pueblo? Sólo falta que me apedreen”. Respondió el Señor a Moisés: “Preséntate al pueblo, llevando contigo a algunos de los ancianos de Israel, toma en tu mano el cayado con que golpeaste el Nilo y vete. Yo estaré ante ti, sobre la peña, en Horeb. Golpea la peña y saldrá de ella agua para que beba el pueblo”.

Así lo hizo Moisés a la vista de los ancianos de Israel y puso por nombre a aquel lugar Masá y Meribá, por la rebelión de los hijos de Israel y porque habían tentado al Señor, diciendo: “¿Está o no está el Señor en medio de nosotros?”

Hagámonos caso al Señor, que nos dice: “No endurezcan su corazón, como el día de la rebelión en el desierto, cuando sus padres dudaron de mí, aunque habían visto mis obras”.

### Segunda Lectura: Rm 5, 1-2. 5-8

Ya que hemos sido justificados por la fe, mantengámonos en paz con Dios, por mediación de nuestro Señor Jesucristo. Por él hemos obtenido, con la fe, la entrada al mundo de la gracia, en el cual nos encontramos; por él, podemos gloriarnos de tener la esperanza de participar en la gloria de Dios.

La esperanza no defrauda, porque Dios ha infundido su amor en nuestros corazones por medio del Espíritu Santo, que él mismo nos ha dado. En efecto, cuando todavía no teníamos fuerzas para salir del pecado, Cristo murió por los pecadores en el tiempo señalado.

Difícilmente habrá alguien que quiera morir por un justo, aunque puede haber alguno que esté dispuesto a morir por una persona sumamente buena. Y la prueba de que Dios nos ama está en que Cristo murió por nosotros, cuando aún éramos pecadores.

### Verso antes del Evangelio: Jn 4, 42. 15

Señor, tú eres el Salvador del mundo.

Dame de tu agua viva para que no vuelva a tener sed.

### Evangelio: Jn 4, 5-42

En aquel tiempo, llegó Jesús a un pueblo de Samaria, llamado Sicar, cerca del campo que dio Jacob a su hijo José. Ahí estaba el pozo de Jacob. Jesús, que venía cansado del camino, se sentó sin más en el brocal del pozo. Era cerca del mediodía.

Entonces llegó una mujer de Samaria a sacar agua y Jesús le dijo:

“Dame de beber”. (Sus discípulos habían ido al pueblo a comprar comida). La samaritana le contestó: “¿Cómo es que tú, siendo judío, me pides de beber a mí, que soy samaritana?” (Porque los judíos no tratan a los samaritanos). Jesús le dijo: “Si conocieras el don de Dios y quién es el que te pide de beber, tú le pedirías a él, y él te daría agua viva”.

La mujer le respondió: “Señor, ni siquiera tienes con qué sacar agua y el pozo es profundo, ¿cómo vas a darme agua viva? ¿Acaso eres tú más que nuestro padre Jacob, que nos dio este pozo, del que bebieron él, sus hijos y sus ganados?” Jesús le contestó: “El que bebe de esta agua vuelve a tener sed. Pero el que beba del agua que yo le daré, nunca más tendrá sed; el agua que yo le daré se convertirá dentro de él en un manantial capaz de dar la vida eterna”.

La mujer le dijo: “Señor, dame de esa agua para que no vuelva a tener sed ni tenga que venir hasta aquí a sacarla”. Él le dijo: “Ve a llamar a tu marido y vuelve”. La mujer le contestó: “No tengo marido”. Jesús le dijo: “Tienes razón en decir: ‘No tengo marido’. Has tenido cinco, y el de ahora no es tu marido. En eso has dicho la verdad”.

La mujer le dijo: “Señor, ya veo que eres profeta. Nuestros padres dieron culto en este monte y ustedes dicen que el sitio donde se debe dar culto está en Jerusalén”. Jesús le dijo: “Créeme, mujer, que se acerca la hora en que ni en este monte ni en Jerusalén adorarán al Padre. Ustedes adoran lo que no conocen; nosotros adoramos lo que conocemos. Porque la salvación viene de los judíos. Pero se acerca la hora, y ya está aquí, en que los que quieren dar culto verdadero adorarán al Padre en espíritu y en verdad, porque así es como el Padre quiere que se le dé culto. Dios es espíritu, y los que lo adoran deben hacerlo en espíritu y en verdad”.

La mujer le dijo: “Ya sé que va a venir el Mesías (es decir, Cristo). Cuando venga, él nos dará razón de todo”. Jesús le dijo: “Soy yo, el que habla contigo”.

En esto llegaron los discípulos y se sorprendieron de que estuviera conversando con una mujer; sin embargo, ninguno le dijo: “¿Qué le preguntas o de qué hablas con ella?” Entonces la mujer dejó su cántaro, se fue al pueblo y comenzó a decir a la gente: “Vengan a ver a un hombre que me ha dicho todo lo que he hecho. ¿No será éste el Mesías?” Salieron del pueblo y se pusieron en camino hacia donde él estaba.

Mientras tanto, sus discípulos le insistían: “Maestro, come”. Él les dijo: “Yo tengo por comida un alimento que ustedes no conocen”. Los discípulos comentaban entre sí: “¿Le habrá traído alguien de comer?” Jesús les dijo: “Mi alimento es hacer la voluntad del que me envió y llevar a término su obra. ¿Acaso no dicen ustedes que todavía faltan cuatro meses para la siega? Pues bien, yo les digo: Levanten los ojos y contemplen los campos, que ya están dorados para la siega. Ya el segador recibe su jornal y almacena frutos para la vida eterna. De este modo se alegran por igual el sembrador y el segador. Aquí se cumple el dicho: ‘Uno es el que siembra y otro el que cosecha’. Yo los envíe a cosechar lo que no habían trabajado. Otros trabajaron y ustedes recogieron su fruto”.

Muchos samaritanos de aquel poblado creyeron en Jesús por el testimonio de la mujer: ‘Me dijo todo lo que he hecho’. Cuando los samaritanos llegaron a donde él estaba, le rogaban que se quedara con ellos, y se quedó allí dos días. Muchos más creyeron en él al oír su palabra. Y decían a la mujer: “Ya no creemos por lo que tú nos has contado, pues nosotros mismos lo hemos oído y sabemos que él es, de veras, el salvador del mundo”.
