# St. Vincent de Paul Catholic Community

2015-16 Annual Financial Report



To my brothers and sisters of St. Vincent de Paul:

On December 8, 2015 Pope Francis blessed and pushed open the great bronze doors of St. Peter's Basilica to launch this Holy Year of Mercy. Declaring that mercy trumps moralizing in the Catholic Church, Pope Francis launched the 12-month jubilee to emphasize what has become the recurrent theme of his papacy: showing both the merciful and welcoming side of the Catholic Church. On that same night here at St Vincent de Paul, our own Doors of Mercy were blessed and formally opened. A blessing intended to communicate to each of us the challenge of truly living out our Catholic faith through both word *and* action.

In light of this special Year of Mercy, this year's annual report will highlight some of the many outreach ministry efforts and how we as a parish community have attempted to live out the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy:

"A Night of Grace, Mercy and Reconciliation" was held from 7 pm, February 19th through 7 am, February 20<sup>th</sup>. Many of you personally invited friends, relatives and acquaintances to return back home to the Church. In preparation for this, many of you spent several weeks in prayer and formation getting ready to welcome, listen to, and pray with our returning brothers and sisters in Christ. On that night, over **100** people walked through our Doors of Mercy seeking to return to the Church. For many, the night culminated with the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Memorial crosses were displayed on the front lawn of our church for two weeks. Each cross represented the life of one of the **4,273** babies who were aborted in Arkansas in 2014. Also, the first NWA March for Life was held with a procession to Planned Parenthood. Following this, 40 Days for Life prayer vigils were peacefully held in front of Planned Parenthood.

Each week, a group of parishioners gather to write letters of support, prayer, and encouragement to those who are incarcerated in the Benton County jail. Others visit and take Communion to the sick and homebound. Each month as part of an interfaith effort made up of several area churches, St. Vincent de Paul provides a hot meal to feed the homeless community in Rogers. Our funeral ministry assists families in the planning of funeral liturgies, as well as providing a luncheon and time for fellowship for those families.

Continuing our long-standing tradition, the Christmas Love Tree program provided gifts, food, clothing and beds for **92** area families.

Our St. Vincent DePaul Society provided rent, utility, and other financial assistance to **1,231** individuals totaling **\$93,668**. Members of the Society visited **337** family homes and logged **4,006** volunteer hours. The Food Panty served **47,853** people with in-kind food donations from the Society of **\$106,132**. In addition, fresh produce grown in our community garden along with thousands of canned and dry food items were donated by parish families every month.

Local non-profit organizations in Rogers, received **\$37,832** from us in cash donations along with numerous parishioners volunteering countless hours in support of these various ministries. Examples include Loving Choices, a crisis pregnancy service who served **469** clients this year, resulting in **79** babies saved from abortion. Helping Hands which served almost **50,000** people this past year and with whom we have maintained a volunteer partnership with for over 20 years, was also a recipient of funds provided by this parish community.

The Haiti Ministry provided **\$60,490** to continue our support of the educational efforts of **2,500** children and for the salaries of **91** teachers in our sister parish St. Francis in Bombardopolis. In May 2017, we will celebrate our first high school graduation class.

In school news a little closer to home—the U.S. Dept. of Education announced our own SVDP Catholic School had received the highest honor a K-12 school can receive in education—the Blue Ribbon Award as an Exemplary High-Performing School. Parish contributions to support the operations of our school this past year totaled **\$321,364**.

Special monthly collections netted **\$173,010** in support of several diocesan sponsored outreach programs.

By most standards, this would be considered an impressive list and yet there is still so much more of God's work being done on a daily basis here at St. Vincent de Paul. For that, you have my utmost gratitude. Together as a community, we can and will continue to live out this Jubilee Year of Mercy by feeding the hungry, visiting the sick and imprisoned, and welcoming the stranger. In return, may the Lord continue to open wide the doors of mercy in the hearts of each of us throughout this parish community. I look forward to continuing this journey of faith with you in the coming years.
